Total Current Positive Healthcare Client Enrollment is 1,541 clients, with Roster Numbers broken down as follows:

867 enrollees in PHC California, a Medi-Cal (Medicaid) managed care plan for people living with AIDS in Los Angeles County.

617 enrollees in PHP (HMO SNP) Medicare Advantage Prescription Drug health plan specifically for Medicare beneficiaries who are living with AIDS and reside in Los Angeles County.

Impulse United is a volunteer group of active individuals in collaboration with AHF, whose purpose is to promote sexual & lifestyle wellness using modern social approaches.

Impulse is now the largest HIV/Wellness group in the world, comprised entirely of volunteers, and, in the last 12 months, organized over 500 events and over 20 campaigns. Impulse is made up of over 300 volunteers in 25 cities.

BLACC - Black Leadership AIDS Crisis Coalition

BLACC was developed to create a coalition of Black-American cultural influencers and health advocates, that through the use of innovative, culturally relevant messaging and initiatives, are revolutionizing outreach to the Black American community and elevating the education and awareness of sexual health and wellness, and bringing greater awareness to the social justice issues disproportionately impacting the health and wellness of Black Americans.

December 2024 AHF Key Highlights Month Over Month

AHF Clients:

As of DECEMBER 2024, and with the December 31, 2024, Global Patient Report, AHF had 2,248,328 clients in care.

This figure represents a global census INCREASE for DECEMBER, up 33,957 AHF clients or patients worldwide), month-to-month since the November 26, 2024, Global Patient Report.

AHF Staff:

- A net increase of 13 AHF employees overall worldwide to 7,799 total AHF employees worldwide in December 2024, including:
 - An INCREASE of 8 U.S. staff
 - An INCREASE of 19 employee in global staff numbers, and
 - 1,759 other AHF-supported staff in global programs (bucket staff, casuals, etc., down 14 staff.

This report also includes a breakout of the 1,561 clients now enrolled in our Positive Healthcare (PHC & PHP) Medicare and Medicaid managed care programs in California.

US & Global Programs & Countries:

US—NO new US AHF Healthcare Centers, AHF Pharmacy sites, Out of the Closet thrift stores or AHF Wellness Centers were added in the U.S. in December 2024.

GLOBAL—AHF's Global program now operates 932 global AHF clinics, ADDING two (2) new global health care centers (HCCs).
